The walk portion of the event will be held entirely outdoors. The time, approximately 75 minutes, will be spent on a leisurely walk with a handful of stops. The planned walk will occur on a trail - expect to walk 1/2 to 1 mile. Feel free to bring a portable chair to use while we wait. For maximum enjoyment, some of the walk will require participants to patiently remain still, quiet and listen closely.

- Dress for the weather as this program will be outside
- Wear sturdy shoes - trails may be wet and muddy
- Bring binoculars if you have them
- Bring a flashlight or headlamp for the walk out after dusk
